Philosophical Statement

Cedarwood's BLOCK C award serves four functions:

- To motivate students to become active participants in the activities of their school
- To provide a blueprint for parents and teachers in planning, encouraging, and setting goals with children regarding school involvement and achievement
- To reaffirm the importance of being responsible, well-rounded individuals and establish a definition of what that is; and how to achieve these goals.
- To provide a form of recognition for students who have met the criteria for the award.

<u>Overview</u>

The BLOCK C Award is available to 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students and is awarded at the end of each semester. The criteria for earning this award reflect a broad base of participation, achievement, and service. In order to qualify for the award, a student must earn the minimum number of points in the following categories:

- Mind Scholarship
- Mind Co-Curricular
- Body Athletics/Fitness
- Spirit Student Leadership/Community Service

It is our hope that all students will actively pursue this award, making it a part of their planning for their total school experience. Whether or not the student receives the award, striving for it will enrich and enhance their educational foundation.

In the sections that follow, specific guidelines and requirements governing the earning of checks in each category are discussed. We encourage parents to work closely with students in planning and setting goals.



MIND

Activities and requirements in this category have to do with intellectual and artistic development. The two components in this category are SCHOLARSHIP and CO-CURRICULAR.

SCHOLARSHIP

ACADEMIC HONORS

- Students may earn a point for each quarter for earning an honor roll award.
 - Principal's Honor Roll (GPA = 4.00)
 - High Honor Roll (GPA = 3.50 3.99)
 - Honor Roll (GPA = 3.00 3.49)
 - No Ds, Fs, or Ns on report card

MAINTAIN 4.0 GPA

• Students may earn one point for each quarter for receiving and maintaining a 4.0 Grade Point Average (GPA)

GROWTH ON iReady READING/MATH DIAGNOSTIC

• Students can earn one point for Reading and one point for Math per semester when they show growth or maintain high achievement on district iReady assessments.

ACADEMIC GRADE IMPROVEMENT

- Students may earn one point per quarter (starting in the 2nd quarter) for improving their grades.
- This is determined by comparing the latest report card grades with those of the most recent past quarter of the current school year.
- * Students may earn one point per quarter if either of these criteria are met:
- Improvement of at least one whole grade in at least one subject area, no decrease in any grades, and no Ns.
- Progress of at least one level in honor roll status with no decrease in grades and no Ns.

CEDARWOOD READING

- Students may earn one point per semester for achieving the CR goal for their grade level.
 - 4th grade needs to read 600 pages and complete 2 reports with a score of 80% or better per semester.
 - <u>5th grade</u> needs to read 1,000 pages and complete 3 reports with a score of 80% or better per semester.
 - 6th grade needs to read 1,400 pages and complete 4 reports with a score of 80% or better per semester.

BIG FIVE MATH

• Students who successfully complete addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and mixed facts (three minutes each test) will earn one point per semester. The point will only be awarded in the semester in which the student receives recognition for mastery of all math facts.

CO-CURRICULAR

BAND/ORCHESTRA

5th and 6th grade students ONLY may earn one point per semester for participating in AND receiving a grade of "O" for Outstanding in the Instrumental Music Program (band and/or orchestra.) Students must participate in performances/concerts and practices. <u>Please note</u>: Guidelines for participation have been set by the "Code of Participation" included at the end of this handbook.

CONCERT CHOIR

• 5th and 6th grade students **ONLY** may earn one point per semester for participating in AND receiving a grade of "O" for Outstanding in the Concert Choir Program. Students must participate in performances/concerts and practices. <u>Please note</u>: Guidelines for participation have been set by the "Code of Participation" included at the end of this handbook.

ESSAY/ POSTER CONTEST

- Students may earn one point per semester for participation in any (or all) of the several essay / poster contests offered throughout the semester. Participation, in this context, means submitting an essay/poster completed by the student which is acceptable to the teacher for entry into competition.
- Acceptable entries must be submitted to the student's classroom teacher who will then submit them to the Site Coordinator for the project to be counted for Block C.

CHESS CLUB

- Students may earn one point per semester for participation in this lunch time activity.
- Students will learn how to play chess and compete against each other to improve their skills.
- Students must attend a minimum of ten (10) times during the semester.

BOOK CLUB

- Students may earn one point per semester for participation in this activity.
- Students will gather in the library before school and be ready to discuss books that the group is reading together and participate in activities fostering collaboration and communication.
- Students must attend a minimum of ten (10) times during the semester.

HISTORY DAY / COUNTY HISTORY DAY

- Students may earn one point during the first semester for completing the 1st semester requirements for History Day
- Students will have the opportunity to earn one point during the second semester if their project is included at the Fresno County History Day event.

SCIENCE FAIR

• Students may earn one point in the second semester for completing a Science Fair project in accordance with the guidelines provided by the advisor.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

• Students may earn one point during the second semester for participating in all practices and the competition.

ORAL INTERPRETATION

• Students may earn one point in the second semester for participating in **all** practices and the CUSD competition.

DRAMA

• Drama productions are offered to students in grades 4th, 5th, and 6th. Students may earn one point for attending and participating in all practices and the performance.

ROBOTICS

• Students may earn one point during the second semester for participating in all practices and the competition.

BODY

Activities and requirements in this category have to do with physical development including fitness and athletics

CEDARWOOD SPORTS

- Students may earn one point for every sport that they participate in for the entire season.
- <u>Please note</u>: Guidelines for participation have been set by the "Code of Participation" included at the end of this handbook.

PEP and CHEER

- Students may earn one point per semester for participating in Pep and/or Cheer.
- Students must attend practices and competitions in accordance with the guidelines provided by the advisors.
- <u>Please note</u>: Guidelines for participation have been set by the "Code of Participation" included at the end of this handbook.

HEATHLY FITNESS ZONE

• Students may earn one point during the second semester for performing in the Healthy Fitness Zone in all five areas of the Physical Fitness Test or at the 85th percentile in all areas earning the Superintendent's Award.

MILE CLUB

• Students that can run the mile in the 85th percentile time limit as defined by the PFT testing guide, can earn one point per semester.

TEAM MANAGER

- Students assigned to manage an athletic team may earn one point per semester.
- Students will be assigned to teams based on availability of manager positions.
- Coaches and/or School Administration will determine the team manager selection process.
- Coaches will be allowed to do "First Come, First Served" or a Lottery System if needed
- Each team will limit Team Managers to 2-3 students

SPIRIT

Activities and requirements in this category have to do with character development. They are designed to provide opportunities for the development of such character attributes as concern for and service to others, active citizenship, civic mindedness, cooperation, responsibility, and dedication.

STUDENT COUNCIL OFFICER

 Students may earn one point per school year for being elected as a Student Body Officer and serving for the full semester in accordance with the "Code of Participation" included at the end of this handbook. Note: Students may serve only one term per year as an officer on the Student Council.

CLASS SENATORS

• Selected students may earn one point each semester for serving as a Class Senator and attending all meetings.

VIDEO CONNECTIONS

- Students may earn one point each semester for Video Connections by filming sports, school events and morning announcements.
- Students must attend meetings in accordance with the guidelines provided by the advisor.

CAFETERIA HELPER

• Students may earn one point each semester for assisting in the cafeteria at least three (3) times during the semester. Students MUST sign in with the Campus Monitors to receive credit.

LIBRARY HELPER

• Students may earn one point each semester for assisting in the library during the semester. Students MUST sign in with the library tech in order to receive credit.

SCHOOL SERVICE

- Students may earn one point each semester for providing a service to the school. There are an unlimited number of services that a student may elect to perform for the school. For example, students may assist in the Library Media Center, participate in campus clean-up activities, assist the custodian, or otherwise provide a service to the school and its student body.
- The service must be agreed upon between the individual student and an adult on campus. The student should ask to meet with the supervising adult to establish individual guidelines for their particular service.
- The service must constitute a minimum of ten (10) times during the semester.
- Does not include classroom book buddies.

HAWK P.A.L.S.

- Peer Assisted Learning Stations (P.A.L.S.) group. Hawk Pals are responsible for leading Room 20 students in various stations and play activities focusing on different social/pragmatic skills as well as functional communication.
- Students can earn one point per semester for serving as Cedarwood Hawk P.A.L.S.

EFFORT & CITIZENSHIP

• Students may earn one point each quarter for earning all "outstanding" effort marks on their quarterly report card.

CODE OF PARTICIPATION

Co-curricular activities are a vital part of our total school program. In addition to providing a variety of exploratory and enriching learning experiences for students, they are important also in building character and shaping attitudes. When students elect to participate in a co-curricular program (e.g., choir, sports, etc.), they must recognize that they have assumed certain responsibilities and obligations to the coach or advisor, to the other members of the activity, and certainly to themselves. The school allocates considerable resources in terms of time, money, energy, and personnel in an effort to provide quality co-curricular programs for our students. In turn, we encourage students to participate and expect quality participation from those who do take part in the activities.

Most of our co-curricular programs have "participation contracts" stating what is expected of the participant. Students agree to the stipulations upon joining an activity. In essence, the terms of these "contracts" reflect the following CODE OF PARTICIPATION:

- 1. The participant will maintain a satisfactory level of scholarship ("C" average, with no "F"s) and demonstrate satisfactory behavior and citizenship.
- 2. The participant is expected to abide by the practice, meeting, or rehearsal schedule established for the activity. Certain absences or tardies may, of course, be excused as with classroom attendance. However, the participant has the OBLIGATION to clear these with the coach or teacher in charge of the activity. Failure to do so is grounds for disciplinary measures as in the case of tardiness or truancy from the classroom.
- 3. The student is expected to participate in the activity in a positive manner. That is, the student is to show proper conduct, strive to learn and grow in his/her abilities or skills, and contribute to the group effort to the best of his/her ability.
- 4. The participant is expected to respect and properly care for all property and/or equipment issued in conjunction with the activity. This is especially pertinent to members of athletic teams who are issued uniforms. Team uniforms are the property of the school. They are expensive and difficult to replace. Students who NEGLIGENTLY lose or cause UNDUE damage to such school property will be charged for its replacement.
- 5. The participant will not arbitrarily or unilaterally quit an activity. Normally, there is a one-week "grace" period during which the student may join an activity and decide if he/she wishes to continue. A student may drop the activity during that time with no conditions. After that time, the student may drop the activity only after consultation between the parent and the coach/advisor and a conference between the student, coach/advisor, and the principal. In the case of athletic teams, a student who drops a sport after the grace period may not join another team during the same season. Note, however, that if a student joins, say, the football team and drops DURING the grace period, he/she may join the cross-country team.

PROCEDURES FOR BLOCK C CERTIFICATION

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Student will use the Block C (Paper) Form as a guideline to keep track of their points.
- 2. Students will submit the paper to their teacher indicating all of the points they have earned.

TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Teacher will review the Block C paper form with students as needed.
- Teachers will be giving reminders throughout the semester about keeping track of Block C points as a courtesy.
- 3. Teacher will verify activities/items submitted.
- 4. Teacher will approve the Block C Award Recipients each semester.

Cedarwood Block C Award Community Involvement

In order to receive ONE POINT per semester for "Community Involvement", students must be part of a community organization in which they fully participate.
